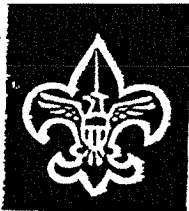

At a session of said Court held at the Judicial Building in the City of Adrian, in said County on the 24th day of JANUARY A.D. 1985

Present: HON. KENNETH B. GLASER, JR. Circuit Judge

The defendant in this cause having been duly convicted of the crime of Criminal Sexual Conduct - Third Degree as appears by the records and files thereof, and the Court believing that the defendant will profit by the leniency of the Court.

Therefore, the Court does order and adjudge that the said Defendant be and hereby is placed on probation under the charge and supervision of Gerald W. Judd as Senior Probation Agent or such other person as the Court may hereafter designate, and for the term of 5 years from and including the date of this order.

It is Further Ordered and Adjudged by the Court that said Defendant, during the probationary term herein fixed shall abide the following terms:

- FIRST: That he shall not during the term of his probation, violate any criminal law of the State of Michigan, or of any other State or of any ordinance of any municipality.
SECOND: That he shall not during the term of his probation leave the State without the consent of this Court.
THIRD: That he shall report to the Probation Agent, in writing and in person at a time set by the Probation Agent. He shall inform the Probation Agent, prior to any change of address or employment.
FOURTH: That he shall absolutely refrain and desist from the use or possession in any manner of illegal drugs prohibited by the Controlled Substance Act.
FIFTH: That he absolutely refrain and desist from the use in any manner of all intoxicating liquors, or furnishing liquors to others, and that he refrain from entering taverns, pool rooms, or other places where gaming tables are kept or run, or where any gaming devices are kept or operated in any manner whatsoever.
SIXTH: That he shall not engage in any anti-social conduct which shall furnish good cause to this Court to believe that this probationary order should be revoked in the public interest.
SEVENTH: That he spend the first six (6) days/months in the Lenawee County Jail with credit for time served from/for No Credit.
EIGHTH: That he shall be gainfully employed or enrolled in a school or training program approved by the probation agent.
NINTH: That he pay into the County Clerk's Office COSTS of \$ 1,000.00 (including attorney fees of None). FINE of \$ None also, RESTITUTION in the amount of \$ None. All amounts will be paid at the rate of \$ 20.00 per week, the first payment will be due 1st Monday after released from Jail.
TENTH: That he shall participate and cooperate in the Community Service Program as directed by the Probation Agent.

### HEAD-ON CRASH

**RAISIN TWP.** — Five people were injured in a head-on collision on M-52 at Shepherd Road Thursday afternoon that backed up traffic at least a mile in each direction. The tie-up caused a rear-end crash nearly a mile away 45 minutes later.

The head-on collision occurred at 4:15 p.m. when a Jackson woman's car slid into an oncoming auto when she tried to avoid a vehicle that stopped in front of her.

The oncoming car, she struck, was driven by Eva J. Frankie, 60, of 1242 Gady Rd., Raisin Township. She was taken by Raisin Township ambulance to Bixby Hospital where she was treated and released.

The Jackson woman, Dawn Joan Benstead, 25, and her three passengers were also treated at Bixby and released. The passengers, all of Jackson, were identified as Jim Fields, 21, Jody Newman, 20, and Vern Kluge, 17.

An Adrian girl suffered minor injuries when the car she was riding in rear-ended an auto stopped by the traffic tie-up on M-52 nearly a mile south of Shepherd Road.

The girl, Wendy Garwood, 11, of 184 1/2 Chandler St., was a passenger in an auto driven by Richard Nolan Vaughn, 32, of 344 Rogers Hwy., Adrian, who sought treatment for her. He was charged with violating the basic speed limit after hitting a car driven by Gregory M. Hill, 31, of Gross Pointe Farms.

### TWO INJURED

**ADRIAN TWP.** — An Adrian man and a Clayton woman were injured in a 4:40 p.m. accident on M-52 just south of Howell Highway.

Sheriff's deputies reported drivers Dolton Holt, 58, of 4897 N. Adrian Hwy., and Joyce Ann Mitchell, 33, of 6100 Plank Rd., Clayton, were taken to Bixby Hospital after the two-car collision. Details of the accident were not available this morning.

Holt and Mitchell were both treated and released at Bixby.

### PASSING COLLISION

**SENECA TWP.** — Two Morenci women were hospitalized with injuries suffered in a head-on collision on M-158 at 3:10 p.m. Thursday.

Cherie Ann Shadbolt, 18, of 125 Clark St., Morenci, and Suzanne Schoonover, of Morenci, were both admitted to Morenci Hospital and were listed in good condition this morning.

Thomas Alan McVay, 24, of 7915 Warwick Rd., Morenci, told sheriff's deputies he was southbound on M-158 half a mile north of Mulberry Road when Shadbolt's oncoming car pulled into his lane to pass another vehicle and hit him head-on.

McVay was treated and released at Morenci Hospital for minor injuries. The accident was still under investigation this morning.

### PIG THEFT

**MANCHESTER** — Thieves loaded up 32 pigs at the Michigan Livestock Exchange north of Manchester and drove off with them Wednesday night or early Thursday morning.

State police at the Clinton post said the pigs, each weighing between 220 and 260 pounds, were taken from a pen at the livestock exchange on M-52 before 4 a.m. Thursday. The pigs are valued at a total of \$3,950.

### SNOW BLOWER TAKEN

**ADRIAN** — A snow blower was reported stolen from the home of Philip Skeels, 60, 1150 W. Adams St., Adrian, on Thursday evening.

Skeels, told Adrian police he discovered the Toro snow blower missing from his garage at 8:20 p.m. Thursday. He had been away from home since Dec. 30. The snow blower is valued at \$260.

### RINGS STOLEN

**MANITOU BEACH** — A diamond ring and a class ring were reported stolen from the home of Pat Mickel, of 6845 Devils Lake Hwy., earlier this month.

Mrs. Mickel told sheriff's deputies on Thursday she discovered the rings missing this week. One was described as a gold anniversary ring with five small hearts with diamonds inside them. It is valued at \$300. The second is a 1970 Blissfield High School Ring with the initials "P.M." inside. It is valued at \$75.

## Circuit Court

An Adrian man convicted of sexually molesting a young boy was given a minimum eight-year prison term Thursday in Circuit Court. And another Adrian man convicted of a criminal sex charge was among four others receiving jail sentences.

Robert Leroy Luce, 42, was sentenced by Judge John C. Timms to an eight- to 30-year prison term on a second-degree criminal sex charge and habitual offender conviction.

Luce was originally charged with two counts of first degree criminal sexual conduct and accused of sexually abusing an Adrian boy under 13 years of age from 1980 to last January. He pleaded guilty to the reduced second degree count and habitual offender charge on Dec. 18.

Douglas Loren Kelton, 26, Adrian, was given a six-month jail term and five years probation by Judge Kenneth B. Glaser on a third degree criminal sexual conduct charge. A first degree charge in-

volving the same Oct. 19 incident in Home Township with a 12-year-old boy was dismissed as part of the plea bargain taken last month. Kelton was also ordered to pay \$1,000 in court costs.

Joey Lynn Deck, 17, Hudson, was given six days in jail and five years probation by Judge Timms on a charge of attempted malicious destruction of a building. He was ordered to pay \$835 in court costs and \$1,200 in restitution.

Deck was charged with damaging the Mingus Fiberglass building, at 109 Mechanic St., Hudson, between Nov. 26 and 28.

Trinidad Gonzalez, 38, Adrian, was given a one-year jail term on a violation of probation conviction by Judge Glaser. He was given credit from Jan. 16 plus 30 days.

David Allen Gould, 18, Hudson, had his probation revoked and was sentenced to six months in jail on a probation violation conviction. Judge Glaser gave him credit for time served since Jan. 11.
