
Dear Mr. Boyd:

The Scout in Troop 35 involved in the case of Arthur Joynes, Scoutmaster, showed erratic behavior at home. His mother became concerned and questioned her son concerning his outside activities. The mother talked with the Family Aid Society of Fairfield, where they live, and complained to the director about the Scoutmaster, indicating she had a suspicion that the Scoutmaster was not of good moral character. The Family Aid Association called me and I immediately called Arthur Joynes and arranged an appointment.

When I confronted him with the accusation of molesting a Scout sexually, he admitted it was true. I explained to him that he would have to resign from the Boy Scouts of America immediately, and also talk with his pastor. The pastor and I have discussed what should be done and we are in accord. Arthur Joynes resigned, promised not to see the Scout involved or any other Scout and seek psychiatric treatment. To my knowledge he has done this. Arthur Joynes does not intend, at this time, to leave this area. His employer knows about Arthur's weakness and agreed to continue his employment provided Arthur gets treatments.

If there are any other steps you feel we should do, please advise us.

Your letter of April 10 addressed to Mr. Rhea concerning Arthur Joynes, Jr., currently registered as Scoutmaster of Troop 35 in Bridgeport, has been referred to me for reply since our Service handles situations of this nature. We have placed the information you provided in our file, but we really should have more information.

Although you state the reason for placing Mr. Joynes on the File is immorality, we would like to have more details. Just what actually happened? What situation or incidents occurred to cause these charges to be made? We would very much appreciate your writing us the complete story. We would also be most appreciative if you could obtain for our files any substantiating documents that may be available pertaining to this matter.

Enclosed is a confidential record sheet which we would like you to complete and return to us as soon as possible, together with the above requested information. This additional material will enable us to identify this individual should he ever again attempt to register in the Scouting program. Thanks for your help.

I am sure you realize that this leaves Troop 35 without any registered unit leader. Undoubtedly, someone is taking over in this position. In order for the unit to continue to receive program inserts in Scouting Magazine, it will be necessary to advise this office of the name of the new unit leader. This should be done by filing with us an additional enrollment for this individual in his new position. Please do not file a separation notice as we have already dropped the current leader.
